

Congratulations on your new kitten!
Here is the health care schedule
we recommend for kittens:



6 Weeks:

- **Physical examination**
- **Feline Panleukopenia/Rhinotracheitis/Calicivirus (FVRCP) core vaccine** (booster every 3-4 weeks until 16 weeks of age)
- **Deworm** (oral liquid or pill) – follow up deworming in 10-14 days with a pill or topical medication to control intestinal parasites, some of which can be transmitted to people
- **Fecal examination** to check for intestinal parasites, some of which can be transmitted to people
- **Receive your free kitten kit**
- **Receive your free application of Advantage**
- Review home dental care, handling the feet, ears, and mouth

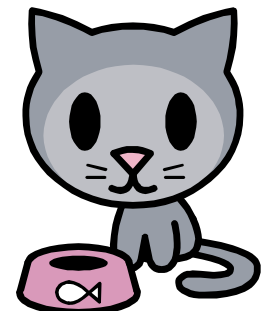
*** We do recommend feeding some canned food daily to your male kitten or cat to help prevent Feline Lower Urinary Tract Disease (FLUTD) and obstruction**

9 Weeks:

- **Physical examination**
- **FVRCP core vaccine**
- **Deworm** if not already done, repeat in 10-14 days
- **Fecal examination** to check for intestinal parasites, some of which can be transmitted to people
- **Start flea/tick prevention and continue monthly through the flea and tick season**
- Discuss nutrition and FLUTD
- **Feline Leukemia vaccine** can be started at 9 weeks of age or older and requires a 3 week booster for cats at risk, i.e. cats that go outside or are in contact with cats that go outside

12 Weeks:

- **Physical examination**
- **FVRCP core vaccine**
- **Deworm** if not already done, repeat in 10-14 days
- **Fecal examination** to check for intestinal parasites
- **Feline Leukemia/Feline Immunodeficiency Virus Test**
- **Feline Leukemia vaccine** for cats at risk i.e. cats that go outside or are in contact with cats that go outside
- **Continue flea/tick prevention**



*** We do recommend Advantage Multi for cats that go outside as it protects them from fleas, heartworm disease, ear mites and the intestinal parasites hookworms and roundworms that can be transmitted to people**

16 Weeks

- **Physical examination**
- **FVRCP core vaccine**
- **Rabies core vaccine required by the STATE OF NEW YORK**
- **Feline Leukemia vaccine booster**
- **Fecal examination** to check for intestinal parasites, some of which can be transmitted to people and to make sure pet was adequately dewormed
- **Deworming** if not already done, repeat in 10-14 days
- **Continue flea/tick prevention**
- Schedule spay or neuter surgery and consider microchipping at that time. Keep in mind that this is the only major surgery your pet may ever have – we try to make it as safe as possible

5-6 Months

- **Spay or neuter your cat**
- **Continue flea/tick prevention**
