



8+ Years:

- **Wellness examination** every 6 months – in a 6 month period, your senior kitty has aged 3-4 years.
- **Feline Panleukopenia/Rhinotracheitis/Calcivirus vaccine** – every 3 years
- **Feline Rabies vaccine to be given yearly as required by the State of New York**
- **Feline Leukemia vaccine** if your cat goes outside, or is in contact with cats that go outside or have an unknown Feline Leukemia virus status – ideally repeat FELV/FIV and Bartonella tests.
- **Geriatric testing to include:**
 - Geriatric blood screen: CBC, chemistry, thyroid hormone level
 - Urinalysis +/- culture and sensitivity
 - Blood pressure
- Nutrition counseling to specifically address geriatrics, specific diseases, dental disease and obesity
- **Fecal examination** to check for intestinal parasites, some of which can be transmitted to people
- **Strategic deworming** every 3 months as recommended by the CDC if your cat has one or more of the following risk factors:
 - your cat goes outside
 - your cat hunts birds and small animals
 - your cat has fleas
 - there are children in the household
 - there is a household member with a suppressed immune system

- Dental evaluation and dental prophylaxis – consider testing for Feline Bartonella, an infectious disease that can cause gingivitis and dental disease.
- **Flea/tick prevention**
